Every year at this time the Anglican churches in the area put together parcels for the seamen who will be spending the Christmas season away from their families. The parcels are collected from all over the province and distributed to the men aboard the various ships that dock in Quebec City and Montreal through the Christmas season. The parcels contain toiletries, playing cards, writing supplies, warm socks, mitts, etc. The items are packed into shoeboxes and wrapped in Christmas paper for the sailors to open.

Donations of items for the shoeboxes (or completed shoeboxes) can be dropped off at Rhonda Stewart's (481 Blvd York W) until Oct 10th and they will be put together with the boxes made by the York Center Guild at its Oct 11th meeting.

Completed shoeboxes can be taken to St. Paul's church until October 22nd as they will be picked up on Oct 23rd.

O gracious God, who so generously lavishes our lives


