Reverend Wendy is trained as a Certified General Accountant and worked in commercial real estate consultancy and was the Controller of the Ontario Medical Association.


We welcome Rev Wendy to our community and hope she enjoys her time here.

Twenty Years later - a Community Hall to Open in York

It has been twenty years since the original York Hall was lost to fire, but at the end of November a new York Hall will be completed. The hall is being built by the Town of Gaspe and while it is situated in York, it is intended to be used by all members of the Gaspe community.

A new 11 member committee has been formed to manage the hall and it is comprised of 3 members from the York Youth Center (Danny Jean, Danny Sams and Lorilee Jean), 3 members from the York River Seniors Group (Tony C. Patterson, Andrew Patterson and Ron Mundle), 1 member from the York ACW (Rhonda Stewart), 1 member from the Wakeham ACW (Ivy Miller), 1 member from the York WI (Trudy Patterson), and 2 members from the general public (Mary Ellen Jean and Tony Patterson). The 2 representatives from the public were elected at a public meeting held on Sept 13th. This committee then elected a President (Danny Sams), Vice-President (Tony C. Patterson), Secretary (Trudy Patterson), Treasurer (Rhonda Stewart) and 2 Reservation Agents (Lorilee Jean and Mary Ellen Jean).

News concerning when the hall will open, how to make reservations, etc will be announced once they have been finalized. The York Hall Committee hopes that the community will take advantage of this new facility and use it often as a place to gather and bring the community together.



Annual Shoeboxes for Seamen Campaign

Once again this year, the Anglican Churches in our area will be participating in the Shoeboxes for Seaman campaign. The shoeboxes are sent to Quebec City and distributed to the crew of ships that dock at the port during the Christmas season. Items that can be put into the shoeboxes are hats, mitts, playing cards, candy, toiletries, writing supplies, etc. All items should be non-perishable. Completed shoeboxes, or donations of items for the shoeboxes, can be brought to Ada Coffin's before October 18th.

Update Submitted by Cemetery Committee

Repairs and Modifications done May 2011 to June 15th 2012:

Many graves that had fallen several inches during the past few years were filled with topsoil and seeded. For this work, lawn grass seed and many truckloads of topsoil were required. Any posts that were not in good condition were either straightened or replaced.

Tombstones which had fallen or were beginning to fall were repaired, with one or two exceptions, where the stones and bases were too heavy to do by hand. Descendants were notified that those stones were in need of repairs.

In May 2012 many trees and alders that had grown over the years on the North and East side of the graveyard were cut, piled and Brian Jean's shovel made short work of getting them cleared.

Craig Quiriple, who did the above work with some volunteer help with the tombstones by Garry Clark, was hired as caretaker of the graveyard in the spring of 211 after our recent caretaker, Francis Parent, was unable to continue due to health reasons. Both these men

did an excellent job. Our caretakers are hired on a year by year basis to mow the grass and to look after the upkeep of the cemetery.

A garbage can will be purchased and placed behind the Church to collect any flowers, etc that are not wanted after funerals are held, and when clean up is being done on the graves by the family.

We want to thank all those who have family and relatives buried in the cemetery, or have plots reserved, for their regular yearly donations.

Thanks also to those who sent in special donations last year after our appeal for financial aid. Because of your donations, we were able to accomplish the above work. Please be advised that any surplus which may be left at the end of each year is placed in a special account in order that work can continue in the future.
