Here is a recipe for soup to warm you up on a winter day:

Cream of Carrot and Turnip Soup (submitted by Gracie Annett)

2 cups sliced carrots	2 Tbsp flour
2 cups diced turnips	1 cup milk
4 cups water	1 cup reserved vegetable water
1 tsp salt	(replace vegetable water with milk for creamier texture)

2 Tbsp Butter

In a medium saucepan, cook vegetables in 4 cups water and salt, about 15 minutes uncovered. Strain vegetables and reserve cooking water. Puree vegetables in a blender. Mix until smooth, adding reserved vegetable water. Set aside. In a medium saucepan, melt butter over medium high heat. Gradually add flour, cook and stir for 2 minutes. Gradually add milk. Cook and stir until mixture thickens. Add salt and pepper. Add vegetable puree and 1 cup reserved cooking water, stirring constantly. Serve with crackers. Makes 4 servings.
