New Cemetery Policy for St. Andrew's York

At the time of the funeral the family is responsible for all arrangements with the rector. Plots can be reserved by contacting either of the two wardens (Tony Patterson or Karl Hackett). Grave digging and snow removal are the responsibility of the family of the deceased. Snow plows are not to be used in the cemetery. A snow blower may be used to open the roadway, but only a hand blower or shovel should be used to open around graves. After the burial the family must arrange to have the excess ground or gravel removed, the site raked, and grass seed planted. Later, the family must arrange to have old wreaths and flowers removed, have sunken graves filled, leveled and seeded, and have the headstones straightened when this is deemed necessary. It is also recommended that all grave sites have a marker.

Maintenance of individual plots is the responsibility of the family to which it is assigned. A caretaker is employed each year to take care of the mowing and trimming of the grass. The budget for the caretaker does not cover all the maintenance and upkeep that is required. Periodically "work bees" and "sponsored projects" have been held to do extra work, but, except for the mowing, the family is responsible.

General rules of maintenance are as follows: Grave sites must be left plain except for markers and/or flowers. Flowers must be beside the tombstone. Existing trees must be removed and no trees are to be planted. Each plot must be flat and level with the surroundings in order to simplify mowing. Boxes, fences, etc. may not be placed on grave sites. If ornamental shrubs are desired they must be placed no more than 2 feet on either side of the headstone, maintained and trimmed to a maximum height of 3 feet. Lots that have been continually neglected by the family will be cleared, leveled and seeded. Note: If you need assistance, local citizens are available for hire. The wardens can offer names when requested.

Lot sizes are 10 by 12 for a casket, or 10 by 6 for urns. More than one burial may take place on each lot. Lots may be assigned in advance of need, but will only be held if the **maintenance fee** is being paid annually. Those who have been assigned lots, and who are not paying the annual maintenance fee, will lose their rights to that lot. For the burial of a casket the box should be 92 inches by 34 inches, with bottom placed 66 inches deep. Urns require a hole 18 inches by 24 inches.

For the initial arrangement, the following fees apply to each cemetery plot:

Persons who pay \$150.00/year or more (for at least 3 years) to St. Andrew's - no cost

Persons who pay less than \$150.00/year to St. Andrew's - \$150.00

Others - \$300.00

Suggested gratuities at the time of the funeral:

Clergy - \$50 to \$100 Organist - \$25 Sexton - \$50 Choir - Optional

Annual Maintenance Fee for all grave sites - \$25.00 per year, with the option od a onetime payment of \$500.00 to cover the maintenance of the site eternally.

The Annual Maintenance Fee and/or donations to the Cemetery Memorial Fund can be places in the appropriate envelope (included with church envelopes) or mailed to Andrew Patterson, treasurer of the Cemetery Committee, 19 Sunny Bank, Gaspe, Quebec, G4X 2M7. Tax receipts will be issued.

To ensure the continued maintenance of the grave sites long after we are all gone, the cemetery committee has established a **Cemetery Memorial Fund**. We invite each person intending to be buried in York, as well as other members, relatives, friends of those buried there to make a donations to this fund. Our objective is \$100,000, with which we could rest assured that the interest would maintain the York Cemetery in perpetuity.

A Bathroom at St. Andrew's is One Step Closer to Being a Reality

As most of you are aware, there has been much discussion surrounding a bathroom at St. Andrew's over the last couple of years. The Working Group is pleased to be able to announce that progress has been made.

Back in June of this year two things happened: first we received the permission of the Bishop to proceed with bathroom and to apply for a New Horizons Grant from the federal government to help finance the project. We were also surprised by an unexpected private donation of \$5,000 towards the cost of this project. The application for the grant money was submitted in early July and we expect a response in early 2015.

Providing the funding is approved, we expect the inside work to be completed by the spring and that the project will be completed as soon as the outside ground work can be completed in the spring.

A Lunch Date

After the Nov 16th service at St. Andrew's there will be a potluck lunch at the York River Community Hall.
